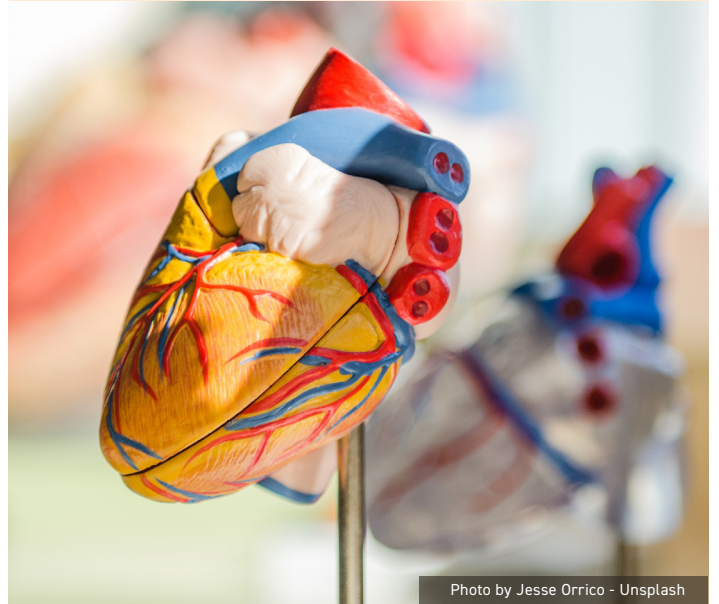

# IS AUSTRALIA LACKING DIETARY AND NUTRITION EDUCATION?

Obesity in Australians aged 18 and over increased from 57% in 1995 to 67% in 2017–18.

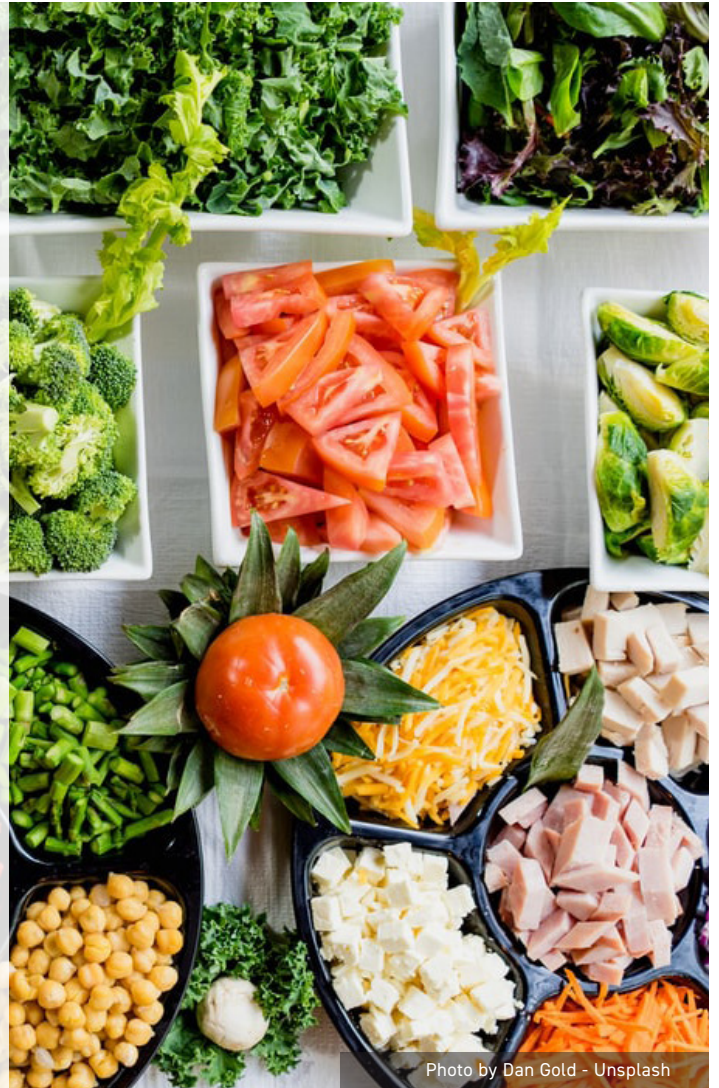

## Brief

Many Australian schools are falling short in providing appropriate food and nutrition education to children and adults alike.

As according to the World Health Organization (WHO); Obesity is defined as abnormal or excessive fat accumulation that may lead to problems such as cardiovascular diseases (mainly stroke and heart disease- which was the leading cause of death in 2012)

When looking at the Nutrition Australia government site the main advocate for healthy eating claiming to have a mission statement of:

Nutrition Australia aims to be the leading provider of nutrition education, with the goal of reducing the incidence of food-related lifestyle diseases and promoting optimal health amongst the Australian community.

The issues in this case is that there is too large of a focus on micronutrient uptake such as healthy lunchbox week, national nutrition week and the healthy pyramid.

This complete neglect on education of basic caloric intake causes a major rift as it doesn't educate Australians that the main driver of losing weight is being in a caloric deficit.

Thus creating the question, why is the basic framework of calories not taught in schools?

## Background

Australia's obesity problem is becoming larger and larger, with little relevant education being provided to children and adults.

Whilst FMCG data reveals that Australians are choosing healthier foods; without proper education on caloric density, many Australians are under a veil of "eating healthy" whilst still consuming energy dense foods or overeating.

Moreover, while education on diet may not be the key to solving obesity as it is a hydra-like issue with multiple systematic factors which contribute to the problem; factual education on the caloric system would be a great place to start a framework to help educate and reduce obesity figures.



# WHAT DO AUSTRALIAN SMALL BUSINESSES NEED IN 2021?

## Brief

A range of support measures introduced in 2020 to support small business through COVID-19 are now being phased out and deferred payments on rent and loans are becoming due. While some businesses have recovered well, others – such as those in hospitality, events, tourism/travel, cinemas, and CBD locations - will likely take longer to recover. We want to hear from small businesses about their concerns going in to 2021 and their ideas for how Government and big business can help.

## Background

The Australian Small Business and Family Enterprise Ombudsman (ASBFEO) was established in 2016 and is led by the Ombudsman, Ms Kate Carnell AO. ASBFEO is an independent agency set up to support small businesses and family enterprises to enable them to grow and thrive.

The office has two key functions: to assist and to advocate for small businesses and family enterprises.

## ASSIST:

We understand the challenges facing small business owners. We provide access to dispute resolution services for those who may be involved in a disagreement, so they can try and find a solution to their problem without having to go to court.

## ADVOCATE:

There are a number of different activities the Ombudsman may conduct in fulfilling the role of small business advocate.

Broadly these include:

- Conduct inquiries and research
- Input into Government policy, legislation and regulations
- Contribute to other inquiries
- Promote good business practice.

# TO REPUBLIC OR NOT TO REPUBLIC THAT IS THE QUESTION AUSTRALIA?

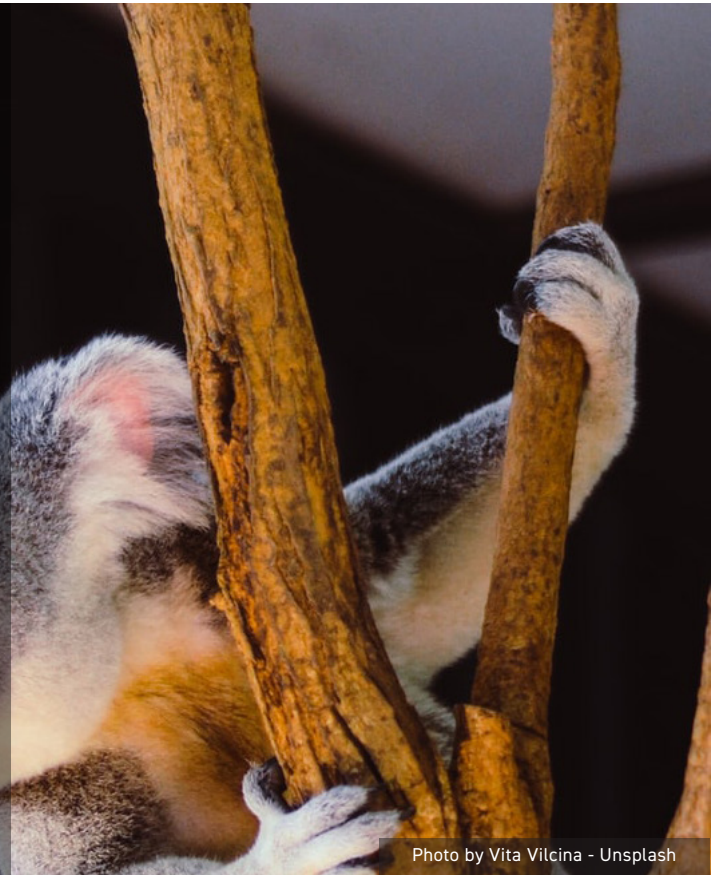

## Brief

As of 2017, 159 of the world's 206 sovereign states use the word "republic" as part of their official names – not all of these are republics in the sense of having elected governments.

However the Commonwealth of Australia will eventually find itself there. It almost did prior to federation, but was cut off with a self-governing colony model.

Historically the purpose of an Emperor, King or Queen was protection. The ability to manage multiple tribes/cultures to protect from others, to trade with others and protect those trade lines.

It has nothing to do with bloodlines or born to rule etc. It served a purpose, sometimes for the good, mostly for the bad. Lots of wars fought because of grudges in Europe, against "royals" who were related.

Yet the history only matters for lessons learned. To move to a republic doesn't do away with poor leadership. So to replace a Queen, we must be vigilante on what it is replaced with.

One proposal is the just replace the Queen with Two Chiefs. A Chief of Law & Order and a Chief of Justice and Welfare. Elected by the Commonwealth of Australia to ensure the Governor General, who they will now appoint, Ministers, Members of Parliament, Government Officers in the legislative, executive and judicial all obey the Common Law. Also any Bills passing Parliament adhere to existing Law and Statutes and to ensure all rights are protected.

The model being pushed, which was already denied in 1999, is a UN and Parliament Puppet President. A president elected by 2/3rd of Parliament. As it stands the Governor General and State Governors fail in their duty to hold Ministers, Members of Parliament, Government Officers to the same laws they hold the rest of the Commonwealth too. Indeed, potential a Common Law Chart of Rules and Rights, as well as an Affirmation of Sovereignty might need to accompany and future changes.

What idea's and solutions do others have for a republic?

*The recent #March4Justice protest across Australia is a social indicator that shows rape culture, toxic masculinity, and sexual violence against women remain entrenched. Those who criticise and speak out against it are silenced. Perpetrators get away while victims are blamed and shamed.*

## Brief

In light of the recent #March4Justice protests in Australia, a country with rich liberal and democratic institutions, a collective uproar has boiled out on the continued prevalence of rape culture, toxic masculinity, and sexual violence against women in society. Moreover, there have been criticisms against people in power abusing their authority to get away with such transgressions.

Here are the core challenges that need to be answered:

- Is there a need to institutionalise a gender equality policy when it's supposed to be a universal human right?
- How is a collective cultural and behavioural change going to be accomplished as far as ending rape culture and sexual violence against women are concerned?
- What needs to be done to end this toxic masculinity culture that "boys will be boys"?
- Is there a need for an independent public inquiry on historic rape allegations against accused incumbent and former federal and state officials?
- Should there be policies needed to be incorporated to strengthen legislation on crimes against women, sexual harassment in the workplace, and gender discrimination?

## Background

The 2021 March 4 Justice (also styled Women's March4Justice) took place on 15 March 2021 across Australia. The protest included a series of events at major Australian cities including the nation's capitol in Canberra. Over 100,000 Australians have attended the events. Reportedly, protests occurred in 40 cities in Australia and the organisers estimated 110,000 people were in attendance. In attendance were the federal opposition leader as well as other politicians from the major political parties.

### Background

The protests were made organised following the perceived lack of response by the Australian federal government to the reporting that a political staffer, Brittany Higgins, was allegedly raped in Australia's parliament house in Canberra, and that historical allegations of rape were made against the country's Attorney General, Christian Porter during his youth.

The protest organisers also stated that an important factor inspiring the event was the public disclosures and testimonies of harassment and assault from former schoolgirls that were collected by activist Chanel Contos who campaigns to improve awareness concerning sexual consent in schools.

The protests is an offshoot of the global #MeToo movement.

### Protest is organised

The protest was initially organised by Janine Hendry, an academic, designer and entrepreneur based in Canberra. Ahead of the 15 March event, Hendry sought to lobby government minister Michael McCormack to respond to the upcoming event under the rubric of the Australian Human Rights Commission's report on sex discrimination. The report was the product of a 18-month national inquiry by the commission, and it examined the issue of sexual harassment in Australian workplaces. McCormack offered no specific assurances that the government would pursue the issue.

Protests took place in over 40 cities in Australia including all state and territory capitols: Sydney, Melbourne, Brisbane, Canberra, Hobart, Adelaide, Perth, and Darwin. The events were endorsed by the Australian Council of Trade Unions.

### Protest demands

The protest organisers formally list four objectives for the protest events described in their petition to the Australian government:

1. Full independent investigations into all cases of gendered violence and timely referrals to appropriate authorities. Full public accountability for findings.
2. Fully implement the 55 recommendations in the Australian Human Rights Commission's Respect@Work report of the National Inquiry into Sexual Harassment in Australian Workplaces 2020.
3. Lift public funding for gendered violence prevention to world's best practice.
4. The enactment of a federal Gender Equality Act to promote gender equality. It should include a gender equity audit of Parliamentary practices.

### Government response

Australian Prime Minister Scott Morrison reportedly offered to meet with the protest organisers in a private meeting. The offer was refused on the grounds that the Prime Minister should be addressing the matter publicly.

Subsequently, while in the Australian Parliament, Morrison attempted to describe the protests in a favourable light, emphasising the democratic nature of Australia that allows such protests to take place without persecution. Morrison referenced unnamed countries in the region that would had met the protesters with violence, that elsewhere protesters are being "met with bullets". The comments were received critically by members from the political opposition.

# HOW TO GET STARTED WITH BITCOIN TRADING IN AUSTRALIA?

There's been a lot of hype about Bitcoin in recent years as its value has skyrocketed from \$49,194.34 on February 3, 2021, to \$63,428.55 on March 2, 2021.

It even peaked at \$72,880.37 on February 21, 2021. With so much money to be made, some of us might be wondering -

**where do we begin and what are the things we need to know before we take the plunge?**

## Brief

This discussion seeks to get the right answers from cryptocurrancy / digital currency experts, banking and finance professionals, and legal practitioners regarding the bitcoin trading in Australia. Since there has been cases of cryptocurrency scams, it is important to separate the misinformation, misconception, and fake news from the facts.

Here are the key questions that need to be answered:

- Is bitcoin trading legal in Australia?
- How to get bitcoin in Australia?
- What are the most reliable Australian bitcoin exchanges?
- What are the commonly traded cryptocurrencies?
- How do we receive bitcoins in exchange for goods and services?
- How do we get started with bitcoin mining?
- Where to store our bitcoins securely?
- Who accepts bitcoin in Australia?

## Background

Bitcoin is a decentralised digital cryptocurrency – the first of its kind in the world. Bitcoin was invented by Satoshi Nakamoto back in 2009. While Bitcoin acts as a medium of exchange, store of value and unit of account, but is not issued under the authority of any government body. You can learn more about the tax treatment of cryptocurrency in Australia from the ATO.

Every Bitcoin transaction is made on a peer-to-peer network online and there is no server or central authority that needs to check first with a bank before clearing a transaction. The decentralised verification process creates the potential for banks to transfer funds to each other faster and at a lower cost than traditional methods.



Currently, international money transfers can come with relatively high fees and higher exchange rates to cover the cost of the banks involved.

Blockchain, the technology behind Bitcoin and other cryptocurrencies, is basically a ledger of who owns which bitcoins. Every transaction made with bitcoins is sent to the decentralised network and 'mined' into the Blockchain. And if you own bitcoins, you can own the 'digital keys' to unlock and spend those funds, unlike traditional currencies.


There are an increasing number of places accepting Bitcoin as payment in Australia and all over the world, but considering how young the currency is, the uncertainty about how it operates, and the risk factors involved, it's considered to be highly volatile.

The Federal Government's financial intelligence agency, Australian Transaction Reports and Analysis Centre (AUSTRAC), has been given powers to police digital currency exchanges like the ones mentioned below. The Australian Securities and Investments Commission (ASIC) has been a strong advocate for regulating the industry for some time, due to the risk of "serious and organised crime groups" exploiting the system. It is unclear at this stage what this change could mean for exchange accessibility and merchant fees.



## Who will lead the thinking and establishment of the quarantine facilities into the future?

Returning much of Australia to a form of pre-March 2020 relies on our ability as a nation to establish a resilient and sustainable international quarantine system, supported by equally resilient and sustainable quarantine isolation facilities.





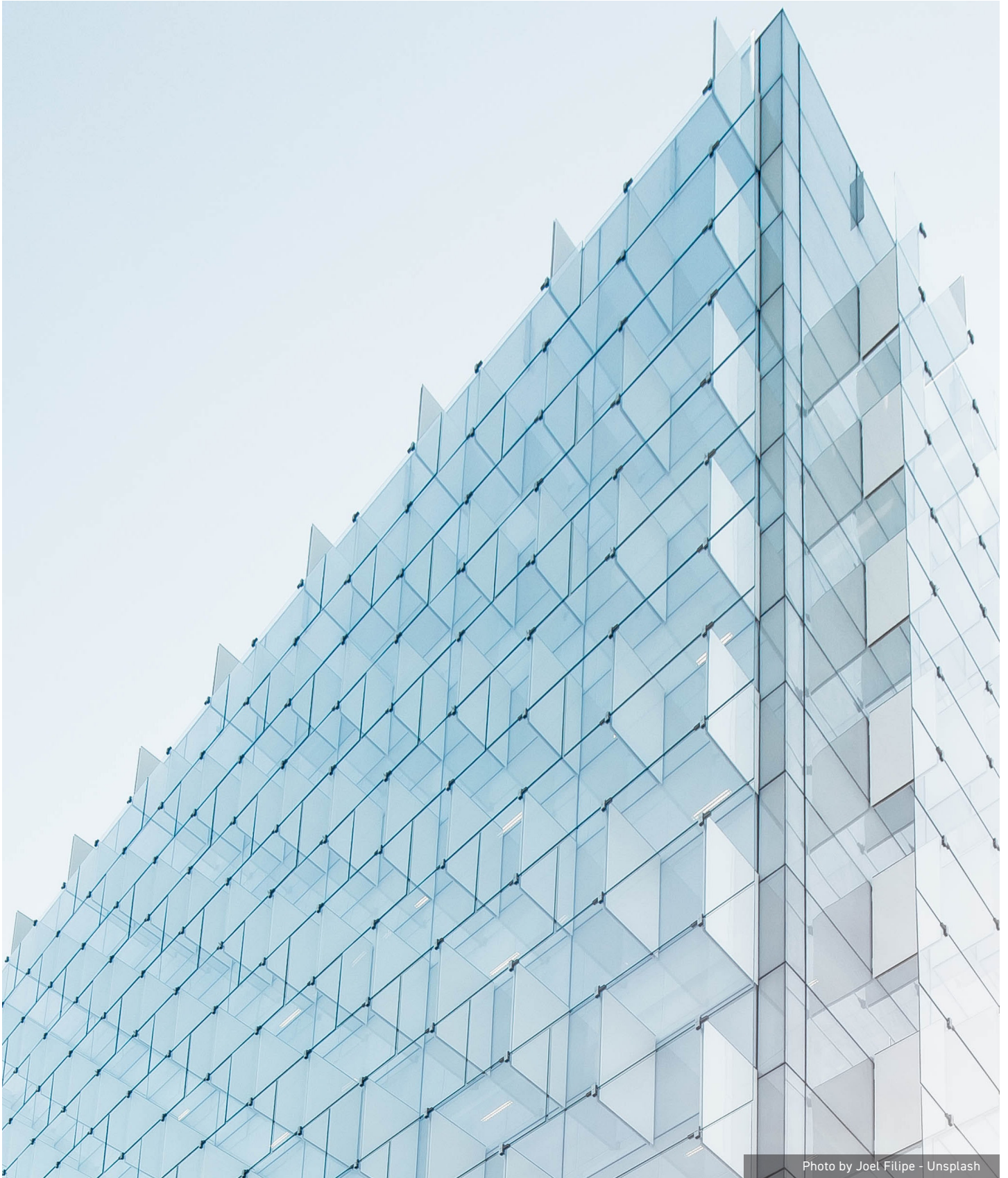
